Incidents of Note

Cannabis Factory. In Burr ridge Place, North Leamington, 138 cannabis plants were discovered in a 3-bedroomed property. The resident has been charged and remanded to court for production of cannabis and possession of an offensive weapon in a private place. He has already attended Coventry Magistrates Court, where he was bailed until his trial scheduled for 21st March 2025.

Cannabis (ii). On 18th February, following on from receiving information and intelligence Leamington SNT officers executed a warrant at an address in LILLINGTON. At the address there was a confirmed Cannabis Grow with 38 plants and two rooms adapted for the growing of cannabis. One male has been arrested and was subsequently charged and remanded with a trial taking place in March'25 at Crown Court. Incident 35 18/02/2025 refers.

Motor Vehicle Thefts. There has been a recent spate of theft from motor vehicles in which the offender has smashed the windows to steal items on show inside. This has happened on Waverley Road, Redland Road, Southway, Tachbrook Road and Brunswick Street. We are checking CCTV and video doorbells where possible to try and identify who is responsible.
