Nuisance E-Scooters

'Safer Pod' Installed in Greggs

Nuneaton SNT along with our Problem-Solving Team have installed a Safer Pod inside Greggs in Nuneaton Town Centre, as a part of Operation Resolve, which is aimed at tackling anti-social behaviour and serious violence. The Safer Pod acts as a visible deterrent and helps us protect local businesses, staff and members of the public. Operation Resolve demonstrates our ongoing commitment to:

- Reduce anti-social behaviour,
- Prevent serious violence,
- Support retailers and staff,
- Keep our town centre safe.

We will continue to carry out patrols in the town centre and work with partner agencies to deal with those causing harm in our community. If you have any concerns, please speak to an officer, report online, or call 101. Always call 999 in an emergency.

Vehicle Obstruction

In March, Nuneaton West SNT attended an incident where the van (in picture) had been reported to police for causing an obstruction.

When the recovery team arrived, they struggled to take the vehicle causing an obstruction, due to the inconsiderate parking of other vehicles on the road. If a recovery vehicle cannot get through, neither can a fire engine. Please remember to park responsibly and in a way that is not causing an obstruction, whether that be on a junction or by not leaving enough room for pedestrians and wheelchair users to get by on the path. The vehicles were reported for causing an obstruction and will receive a fine in the post. PCSO Melodie Leech.



Policing of the Recent Protest in Nuneaton

We worked with all involved to balance the rights of those people who wished to protest peacefully, with the needs of the local community. We were there throughout the day engaging with everyone and making sure all were safe. The Protest was mainly peaceful, but unfortunately, several individuals attempted to use this as an excuse for criminal behaviour. As a result, we arrested seven

men for public order offences. Thank you to those of you who protested peacefully and safely, and to the wider community, who went about their business as usual.

It had no registration plates and a smashed window, so following some checks on the vehicle, it was found to have been stolen in 2024. The vehicle was then been recovered.



Anti-Social behaviour on Bikes

In March seven bikes were seen tearing through Bedworth - thanks to the public for raising the alarm. When PC Blaney and PC Lach attended and boxed them in, they discovered: 3 stolen bikes and 4 uninsured bikes, so the bikes were seized, and the fun stopped. Instead of causing chaos, the riders spent Mother's Day exactly where they belonged - at home with their mums or carers' thinking about their life choices.

Well done, Bedworth public – 'You made their 'Mother's Day!'

Congratulations also to the

police for their prompt action. A number of males were detained at the scene and will be dealt with accordingly, including points being added to their driving licences in future, when they request them from the DVLA.

Community Event

In March 2026 Bedworth SNT organised a community event at Tesco, Bedworth. The aim of the event was to try and reduce Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in the Town Centre and promote some of the local sports and youth clubs available to families in Bedworth. When tackling ASB daily and talking to the people involved, we are usually given the excuse, 'There is nothing to do here'. The event was successful, and Bedworth SNT have now helped to secure funding for a free Youth Club on a Tuesday evening, which will hopefully be up and running in the next few months

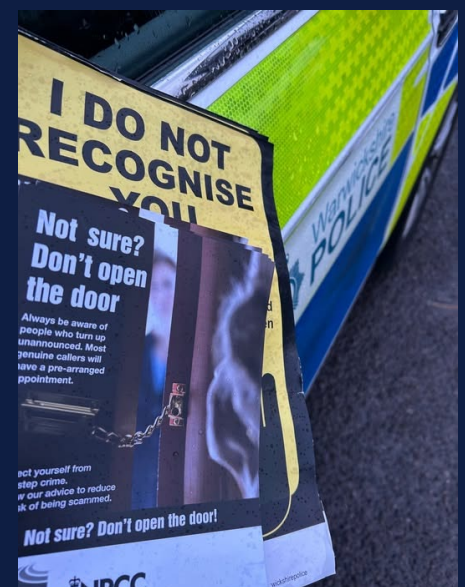
Anti-Social Behaviour

Beware Doorstep Callers

In March Bedworth East Safer Neighbourhood Team were out distributing leaflets around the area to some of their elderly residents. The leaflets are designed to remind people of the risks of 'Doorstep Crime' by 'Cold Callers' and advise against opening the door to anybody you do not know. The picture on the leaflet shows a 'safety Chain' being used to see who is at the door without allowing them access.

Operation Undertook

There was a very sad incident in Chesterfield recently, when a boy age 14, died after a car and an electric motorbike crashed. It was really brave of the parents of the victims to speak out about the dangers of electric bikes, as a warning to others.



Police Sergeant Adam Corless said. "There is a reason these bikes are banned from the road. Although the thrill of riding an electric bike on the road seems exciting, it can also be fatal. That quick thrill, is not worth the risk. Followers of our social media will know about Operation Undertook and how hard we are working to tackle the illegal and antisocial use of motorbikes. We're doing it, to prevent incidents like this and avoid other families suffering like this.



Parents of these children, please work with us for your child's sake!" Nuneaton and Bedworth SNT seized 115 bikes since the start of the operation, helping to make the area safer for everyone. PC Ben Rowton reported that, on one day alone in March, 5-E scooters were seized (they're illegal), 1 E-bike seized (if your E-bike has no pedal assist, it's illegal), 3 vehicles removed from the roads (1 for no tax, 2 for no insurance) and 1 driver was arrested for suspected drug driving.
