Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 8th March 2026

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Thank you to our Community Speed Watch volunteers.

We are really proud of what our Community Speed Watch (CSW) volunteers achieve. So, we invited them to a special event at Old Shire Hall in Warwick to say thank you.

During the event, we celebrated their achievements in 2025 and provided updates including a national evaluation that shows just how effective CSW can be in changing driver behaviours.

Receiving a warning letter about speed has a profound impact on a driver's behaviour: very few drivers - approximately 10% - receive a second letter, showing just how effective it is.

This means our volunteers make a real difference to reducing speeding in local communities like yours.



In cases where education is ignored and there is evidence of repeat or excessive offences, even across county borders, enforcement and prosecution follow.

Thank you to our Community Speed Watch volunteers for helping to make our roads safer.

What is Community Speed Watch?

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is a national initiative where active members of local communities join together to monitor speeds of drivers in their local area with support from the police. In Warwickshire each group uses a digital speed detection device, independently purchased by either the group itself or the local parish council.

Any drivers found to be exceeding the speed limit are referred to Warwickshire Police and receive a warning letter with the aim of educating them to reduce their speeds.

Behind Every Blade: new campaign to encourage young people to report knife concerns.

We're supporting a new countywide campaign urging young people to report any concerns they have about someone carrying a knife.

Through Behind Every Blade we're encouraging people – particularly young men – to report anonymously when they have concerns about someone carrying a knife.

Through this, we're aiming to decrease criminal use of knives.



Inspector Ryan Walker from Warwickshire Police explains: "If you are concerned someone is carrying a knife the information you provide could save a life; it could save their life.

"We will act on all information provided. People who carry knives are often scared and trapped. They might be being exploited by criminal gangs and are pressured to carry a knife.

"The information you provide means they could get help before they get hurt or arrested. We can address the reasons they feel the need to carry knife and maybe help to move them away from a life of crime.

"It comes down to a simple choice; if you know someone is carrying a knife you can ignore it and hope for the best or you can report it and potentially save a life.

"Ask yourself, could you live with the consequences?"
