The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. Reporting incidents to the police

<u>Our advice is – Contact us first, then consider your social media response.</u>

Monday 19th May marks the start of Op Sceptre week.

Tomorrow (19 May) marks the start of Operation Sceptre, a twice-yearly nationwide week of events aimed at tackling knife crime and steering young people onto better trajectories. Neighbourhood officers across the county have planned events through the week, ranging from the installation of knife surrender bins to going to schools with VR headsets to deliver powerful presentations on the dangers of carrying a knife. Officers will also be out across the county engaging with our communities to talk about prevention – while also conducting knife sweeps and targeted patrols. We'll also be promoting Operation Talkative – a force scheme where people from all our communities are encouraged to come forward and tell us if they know of someone carrying a weapon. Through the operation, we look at ways we

can intervene early, to prevent tragedy and to direct young people to more positive outcomes. Keep an eye on our Facebook page through the week as we bring you updates.
