OP PLENTY

#OpPlenty has now launched in Atherstone, Coleshill and the surrounding villages.

The scheme was already running in Nuneaton and Bedworth, and since last year, there were 35 people visited as a result of Op Plenty.

Op Plenty involves our Safer Neighbourhood Team officers dropping by the homes of vulnerable people in our community for a cup of tea and a chat to check whether they are OK and if there's any further support that can be provided.

Inspector Andi Gibbons of North Warwickshire Safer Neighbourhood Team said "We're very happy to announce our support of Op Plenty in Atherstone and the surrounding villages. "We are in quite a rural part of the county, and we're aware that this can sometimes make the loneliness of older people in particular who find travelling difficult more pronounced. "Op Plenty gives us a way of finding out where those who would appreciate us dropping by are, and a reason to check in."

Operations

OP RESOLVE – ATHERSTONE

Atherstone SNT have been working in partnership with Warwickshire Retail Crime Initiative, Atherstone Town Council and the Community Safety Team from the Borough Council.

Our goal is to help reduce crime in Atherstone Town Centre, offer crime prevention advice, and ensure a safe environment for both local businesses and the public.

Through partial funding we have managed to sign up 26 new members to the WRCI over the last few weeks.

Working with our highly experienced CCTV operators and state of the art equipment these businesses will have a direct radio link to the CCTV control room along with access to the retail Disc app.



Coleshill SNT conducted a car key burglary operation around Coleshill Town.

Officers found 5 vehicles insecure which enabled them to speak with the registered keeper, offer crime prevention advice in relation to vehicle crime and ensure the vehicles were secure.

These operations have been carried out by the team over the last few months as we look to tackle vehicle crime and also heighten awareness to members of the community regarding the issue.

We have been working in partnership with North Warwickshire Borough Council who have supplied us with faraday pouches to give out to community members with keyless entry vehicles.

OP RESOLVE – ATHERSTONE



Early morning patrols continue around residential areas in Atherstone regarding car key burglaries.

Whilst on patrol PCSO Scott has found a stolen motorbike taken during the night from the Hinckley area in Leicestershire.



The Problem Solving Team would like to praise PC Louis Thompson and North Warks SNT, who have tackled violence within Night Time Economy at Red Lion P.H, Coleshill.

Through analysis, the plan owner identified a specific time when offences occurred at the pub, he has worked closely with the licensee which has seen robust changes to door security staff, improved entry policy which incorporated the use of the knife wand, searching and a reduction to entry times. Long term improvements have been made to the outdoor space, including the installation of taller fencing to ensure customers enter via the main entrance.

Significantly, funding has been authorised for retail radios and the installation of a signal booster within Coleshill to improve coverage for the radios via WCRI, all of which has been positively received by residents, businesses and councillors.

The hard work and measures that have been implemented have had a positive impact, seeing a 72% reduction of incidents with the level of violence reducing dramatically, making The Red Lion pub a safer place to socialise.

Off Road Bikes

The Off Road Team have been patrolling hotspot areas.

A Section 59 Warning Notice has been issued to a male who has been riding an off-road bike on the road in one of the villages. If we see him riding the bike again, it will be seized. Further off-road bike patrols will be conducted over the next couple months.

If you witness someone riding an off-road bike in an antisocial manner, please report them through the QR code below.

Operations

OP TAVACO – VEHICLE CRIME

In conjunction with the chair of the local communities board and North Warwickshire Borough Council and North Warwickshire Community Safety Partnership funding has been obtained for a large quantity of faraday pouches to be utilised by local officers.

This is an attempt to address keyless vehicle thefts whereby officers are working hard to bring offenders to justice.

Various policing operations are to take place whereby the faraday pouches will be issued but if any local residents would like a crime prevention visit and faraday pouch please contact the below email address and request will be considered.

Officers from Operation TAVACO and Warwickshire Rural Crime Team have been conducting proactive patrols in the north of the county, focusing on areas known for anti-social behaviour involving off-road vehicles.

This vehicle and its occupants were found next to a hotspot area, the riders made off on scrambler bikes upon sighting officers, abandoning a van containing quad bikes. The vehicle was found to be insecure, and none of its contents had the correct documentation.

As a result, the van and its contents have been seized and recovered, and Section 59 notices have been issued.

We want to send a clear message: The illegal and anti-social use of off-road bikes will not be tolerated. These activities pose a serious risk to public safety and the wider community, and we will continue to take firm action against those responsible.

Stolen from Tamworth last night, it is now undergoing a forensic examination before being returned to its owner!

Bobbies on the Beat

Coleshill SNT officers increase patrols in Kingsbury village following concerns raised by residents regarding recent incidents involving local youths.

Bobbies on the Beat

High-Visibility Patrols Addressing Community Concerns in North Warwickshire.

Officers from B Shift Response have been actively conducting high-visibility patrols across North Warwickshire as part of our ongoing efforts to tackle anti-social behaviour and address concerns raised by local residents.

These targeted patrols are a key aspect of frontline policing, allowing officers to engage directly with members of the community, offer visible reassurance, and deter criminal or disruptive activity. By maintaining a strong and consistent presence in key areas, we aim to build public confidence and ensure North Warwickshire remains a safe and welcoming place for everyone.

We continue to encourage residents to report concerns and work with us to keep our communities safe.

Atherstone SNT had the pleasure of doing something a little different last week with Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership.

The project that we helped with was filming a road safety video, on the subject of speed, for WCC road safety education team. The message that the video is sharing is that it is safest for children to wait until there is no moving traffic when crossing the road as it is difficult for children to judge the speed of traffic.

This means crossing at a crossing, like toucan crossings or zebra crossings, or on a road when there is no traffic moving.

The video will also remind children to do a 'lifesaver look' at crossings - even when the green man is lit, do one last look to check that all traffic has seen you and stopped.

This video will be used in schools across the county to educate the children around crossing the roads.

"I applied to the cadets when I was 13 after my mum showed me an advert on Facebook. As this was during lockdown, my interview was on Zoom. I was definitely nervous as I'd never had one before, but I soon settled into it and worked to complete the tasks. Asked to prepare a 30 second speech about myself, I decided to play my guitar while saying mine and I think my musical talent won them over as a few weeks later I was invited to join! I had an overwhelming sense of achievement, and my family and friends were delighted I'd been successful.

"The first time I went to headquarters in Leek Wootton I was nervous to say the least. I had so many questions in my head: Would I be the youngest? Would I fit in? How awful could marching be? I turned up with a face mask on and a large backpack containing my boots. Myself and the other cadets were introduced to the scheme and made to feel welcome. We had networking activities to get us working together and I spoke to cadets from all different backgrounds.

Although I was one of the youngest, it didn't matter as we were all in the same boat. As part of the programme, I attend a weekly session at Leek Wootton where we work on our policing knowledge. We have talks from police officers and staff in different roles and have had demonstrations from the dog unit and firearms officers. We develop our leadership skills with team exercises and in the summer months play touch rugby and frisbee.

"Every year we go on a week's excursion, which is one of the most memorable experiences you will have as a cadet. It teaches us to push ourselves outside our comfort zone while participating in activities such as surfing and raft building. Being a cadet has given me many incredible opportunities such as meeting royalty and visiting the security institute. I've also been out patrolling with officers around Leamington which was very eye-opening. Even though I joined as a young teenager, through all the teamwork tasks, volunteering opportunities, building friendships and memorable experiences, I've really developed as a person and will bring these newfound skills into adulthood. Oh, and to answer my earlier marching question - you'll get used to it!"

Arrests and Outcomes

Back in 2023 the police and trading standards with the support of the shop owner shut down a shop in Atherstone that was dealing in counterfeit products.

The male behind this shop has been sentenced to 3 years and 8 months in prison and ordered to pay £20,000 after Derby Council linked him to similar offences.



Officers with the support of trading standards have attended a shop in Atherstone whereby it was selling illegal tobacco.

Trading standards have seized the tobacco and will be speaking with the owner of the shop.



Eight people have been sentenced to nearly thirty years in prison for stealing parcels.

Between September 2022 to February 2023, five men who were working at a parcel courier in Kingsbury conspired to steal high-value items being sent through the company including computers, TVs and electric bikes. They placed new delivery labels over existing parcels within the company's hub, in order to get them delivered to addresses under their control.

Three relatives were also convicted for purchasing the new labels and allowing their addresses to be used to receive the items. The items, with an estimated total value of £820,605.55 were sold on websites such as Facebook Marketplace and eBay, with others found packaged up to be sent to Romania.

The offences came to light after claims were made by business customers about their items not being delivered.

The company investigated and discovered the offending, intercepting a few parcels which had been over-labelled. 11 addresses were identified which linked to those involved.



Inspector Andi Gibbons has addressed the community after a suspected arson incident earlier this week.

We were called to Ansley Common allotments around 5.45pm on Monday evening (24 March) by the fire service after a report of a caravan on fire.

Insp Gibbons said: "Thankfully the fire service was able to quickly put out the blaze and although no-one was injured, the consequences could have been much worse.

"I'd like to reassure you an investigation has begun, and we've carried out several enquiries as we seek to establish the cause of the fire. At this time, we're remaining open-minded, but we believe it may have been started deliberately, so if you know something or saw someone, please tell us.

"Equally if you were in Ansley Common or the area around the allotments from 5pm onwards on Monday, I'd encourage you to please get in touch. Any information may help our ongoing investigation."

Community Speed Watch

PCSO Yaqub has been training volunteers for speed watch this month.

This month, the speed watch teams have been out conducting speed checks in the villages. The community speed watch groups are a valued part of our communities. E-Scooters

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance. There are two ways of using an e-scooter:

- by privately owning one
- by renting one through an authorised rental scheme

Owning your own e-scooter

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car. Where you can use your own e-scooter: If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.

Vehicle Crime

Do you have a keyless entry vehicle?

Thieves can steal your keyless vehicle by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your start device (key) in order to start your vehicle.

Help to protect your vehicle by:

- Make sure your vehicle is properly locked/secure and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal.
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock (preferably a disk lock), instal a driving parking post or use a wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals as it will be time consuming for them to move the vehicle.
- Fit a tracking device into your vehicle.
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal to your keys.
- Remove batteries from your spare key or put them in a separate Faraday pouch.

And remember to be on the lookout for people acting suspiciously and report it by calling 999!

PCSO Mitchell and PCSO Smith have been out distributing faraday pouches.

These have been distributed around some of our high targeted areas. The pouches have very kindly been purchased by North Warwickshire Borough Council, in our steps to tackling vehicle crime.

We believe a joint approach is key when tackling crime. We have received lots of great comments from residents, many of whom we have been able to offer lots of crime prevention information to.

Initial police response to vehicle crime.

Initial call managed by either LPRC or control room and if the incident is live and ongoing seek immediate deployment.

During the initial contact, the call taker will provide reassurance and discuss all investigative opportunities such as CCTV, Witnesses, Forensic opportunities with the victim or witness.

These questions and responses will be documented on the Strom log and an investigation is then created.

Call taker will provide scene preservation advice to the victim

Should there be no investigative opportunities the investigation will be sent to the CCC to complete and record a review and ensure that all investigative opportunities have been considered.

At this stage a decision will be made to either file the investigation if there are no further opportunities to pursue a positive outcome or allocate to an officer with an action plan should further potential investigative opportunities exist to seek a positive outcome.
