The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of Police officers and Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.*

## **Speed cameras go live on the A46 near Stratford-upon-Avon**

Two new multi-directional automatic speed cameras have been installed on the A46 between Stratford-upon-Avon and Alcester.

The installation is the result of collaboration among key stakeholders within the Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership to improve road safety in Warwickshire.

Between 2021 and 2025, there have been 3 fatal, 8 serious and 22 slight injury collisions on this stretch of road, classifying it as a 'high harm route'.

The majority of these collisions were found after investigation to be caused by road users 'failing to look properly or failing to judge the other person's path or speed.

Careless/reckless, in a hurry, loss of control, and exceeding the speed limit are also among the top 10 factors contributing to collisions.

Evidence gained over many years demonstrates that speed cameras are extremely effective at reducing road casualties, especially those of a higher severity.

Inspector Dave Valente, lead for the partnership's Safer Speeds Working Group, which also includes National Highways, Warwickshire County Council and the Police and Crime Commissioner's Office said:

"Reducing excess speed in Warwickshire is a priority for us, because more than half of all fatal collisions nationally involve speed as a contributing factor.

"Working alongside our communities through initiatives like Community Speed Watch, as well as our mobile enforcement teams, we use a visible presence on our roads to encourage safer speeds and help educate drivers on the law. However, in some high-risk locations, only a static enforcement device can ensure that speed limits are consistently respected."

Chair of Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership Philip Seccombe said: "The A46 has been raised by local people as an area of concern for a number of years. We need all drivers to take responsibility for themselves and others' safety by always staying within the speed limit and driving at an appropriate speed for the conditions. If everyone can do this, our roads will become much safer immediately."

Fiona McKenzie, Route Manager for National Highways, said: "Safety is our main priority, and we remain committed to reducing the number of people harmed on our roads. The evidence shows that when drivers reduce their speed, collisions are less likely and serious injuries and fatalities are reduced. Slower speeds help protect not only other motorists but also cyclists and the wider community.

"The new cameras will help support our commitment, and we'll continue to work closely with Warwickshire Police and the Road Safety Partnership to monitor safety across the county."
