Good News (continued)

PC Martin has attended court in Coventry in April where a closure order has been granted against a property in St Pauls Square, Learnington. Police had a substantial amount of intelligence linking the address to drug dealing, drug use and associated anti-social behaviour. So, the

decision was made to apply to the courts to have the property closed down for 3 months.

A closure order prohibits anyone from entering the property during the closure period and can be granted by magistrates where criminal or antisocial behaviour is having an effect on the public. Anyone in breach of the order can be arrested and imprisoned for up to 52 weeks.

PC Martin said "I am pleased that the magistrates agreed that a closure order was indeed necessary and am



happy that the local residents will get some much-needed respite from the behaviour that has been associated with this address for some time now, this is a good day for the residents of St Pauls Square and surrounding areas. If you suspect an address is being used in relation to county lines drug dealing, drug use or anti-social behaviour I would encourage people to report it on 999 in an emergency, 101, online or anonymously via CrimeStoppers."

A hate crime is any criminal offence that is perceived by the victim or any other person to be motivated by a hostility or prejudice based on a person's:

- Race (including nationality, national origin, ethnic origin, race and colour)
- Religion or belief
- Sexual orientation
- Gender identity
- Disability
- Individual characteristic that makes someone appear different

What can you expect from the police?
