Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Hot weather home security

With the hot weather we're reminding people to keep their homes secure.

In the summer months, unfortunately we do tend to see an increase in burglaries. With doors and windows often being left open, this can present an easy target for thieves.

Here are some simple steps you can take to help protect your property:

- Close and lock all windows and doors before going to bed or leaving your home even for a short time.
- Use window restrictors that allow ventilation without allowing full access.
- Install motion-activated lights or smart lighting around entry points to deter intruders.
- CCTV or video doorbells can act as both deterrents and valuable evidence.
- Check garden gates and sheds—ensure they are locked, and tools are out of sight as these can be used to gain access to your home.
- Be a good neighbour. If you see anything suspicious, report it to us immediately.
- Find out about property marking schemes such as Smartwater. If an item is marked it will be much harder for a thief to sell on. Also, if recovered, stolen items can then be returned to their rightful owner.

Let's work together to keep our community safe. If you have any concerns, please contact your local neighbourhood policing team.

Checklist for securing your home when you leave it.

It's vital to leave your home secure whenever you leave it. Getting into an 'exit routine' can help ensure that you don't forget obvious, important things, like not leaving your valuables near windows, or no lights on if it will be dark before you get home. Here's what you should do just before you go out.

Become a creature of habit.

Try to get into the habit of following your own course of action when you lock up your home. This will ensure that you don't forget anything.

Here's what we recommend you do before you go out:

- close and lock all your doors and windows, even if you're only going out for a few minutes.
- double lock any door
- make sure that any valuables are out of sight.

 keep handbags away from the letterbox or cat flap and hide all keys including the book keys or valuables through even a small opening. car keys, as a thief could hook keys or valuables through even a small opening.
- never leave car documents or ID in obvious places such as kitchens or hallways
- in the evening, shut the curtains and leave lights on
- if you're out all day, then it's advisable to use a timer device to automatically turn lights and a radio on at night.
- set your burglar alarm.
- make sure the side gate is locked.
- lock your shed or garage.
- lock your bike inside a secure shed or garage, to a robust fitting bolted to the ground or wall, like a ground anchor.

Going away? - Here are five tips to help you keep your home and belongings stay safe while you're away:

- if you're off on holiday and wish to post anything on social media, make sure your posts aren't public and that they're only seen by your friends.
- leave lights and a radio on a timer to make the property appear occupied.
- get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property or join a Neighbourhood or resident Watch Scheme
- consider asking your neighbours to close curtains after dark and to park on your drive.
- remember to cancel newspaper and milk deliveries.
