Tackling knife crime. At the end of May the force took part in Operation Sceptre, a nationwide campaign to tackle knife crime. This included giving people the opportunity to safely and anonymously surrender knives, no questions asked. There was a knife surrender bin outside Nuneaton and Bedworth Police Stations and outside Ropewalk Shopping Centre in Nuneaton. If you have information or concerns about someone carrying a knife, please report it to the police by calling 101. If someone is carrying a knife on them at the current time, then call 999. If you wish to report anonymously you can contact Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

Please don't turn a blind eye or assume someone else will report it. Every piece of information counts, and it could save a life.

Reducing Anti-Social Behaviour

Before the Easter school holidays, SNT Inspector Ryan Walker secured funding to get the **Guiding Young Minds Bus** -



shown below - as a response to anti-social behaviour in Nuneaton. Inspector Walker said, "We know that children and teenagers congregate when they've got nothing to do, and it usually gets worse in the school holidays. So, the bus stopped off at key areas in Nuneaton where we know there are issues with anti-social behaviour. It was all part of a bigger plan by the county council for all of us to work together, to make our town centres

more desirable, and to reduce crime." The bus was staffed by Anton, who founded 'Guiding Young Minds'. He is a motivational speaker, an urban specialist and a consultant in gang culture and serious youth violence. The bus was equipped with video games, snooker, pool and similar activities. Basically, it gave young people something to do and



somewhere to be, while having Anton there to spread some positive messages. Combined with increased foot patrols in targeted areas, the bus brought about a noticeable reduction in anti-social behaviour. We have had really good feedback from schools and businesses, so the scheme proved to be a success.

Shoplifting

The Business Crime Team worked hard in May to tackle theft and shoplifting. Successes included the arrest of two people, who were jailed after admitting various crimes including shoplifting and theft from motor vehicles. A 25-year-old man from Nuneaton was sentenced to nine months in prison for 18 counts of theft from shops and a 44-year-old woman was given a ten-week jail sentence after she admitted ten offences including theft from shops and motor vehicles in Nuneaton.

Illegal Driving of Vehicles. In June, four drivers were stopped for driving the vehicles shown below, on a Provisional Licence without L plates or supervision. All four vehicles were seized. For anyone with a non-EU licence, it will be valid for 12 months from when you enter the UK. After this period, you will need to apply for a UK provisional licence, then take and pass the UK theory test and practical driving test.










Speeding Vehicles. At the end of May, Nuneaton SNT conducted speed checks to support the Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership, following complaints about speeding from members of the public. We are pleased to say that most of the vehicles checked were driving at or below the speed limit, however a small number were in excess of 30mph. We remind drivers that speed limits are in place to keep **all road users and pedestrians safe**. More checks will be carried out over the coming weeks and months, so please stick to the speed limit

In May, as part of Knife Crime Awareness Week, Bedworth SNT did numerous engagement events each day. For example, PC Pedley and PCSO Tracy Hall visited Keresley Newlands Primary School. Knife Awareness VR set sessions were



delivered, followed by speaking with pupils at break time and getting to know the children better. At 6pm on the Friday evening, there was an opportunity for anyone to discard knives in a knife bin at the front of Bedworth Police Station. This was intended to prevent knives falling into the wrong hands, to allow people to deposit knives safely, and to encourage anyone that might carry a knife to think about it and make a positive choice to discard it.

In April, PC Jake Blaney, together with officers from Bedworth SNT and The Response and Rural Crime Team, were out on off-road motorbikes to tackle issues reported by the public. In Marston Lane Cemetery, a rider of an off-road motorbike tried to escape into the wooded area but was caught and detained. The bike was then seized, and the rider was issued with a traffic offence report for

several offences. They also found two burnt out motorbikes, abandoned in a wooded area, which will be removed.


